Key Responsibilities

- Conduct comprehensive assessments of patients' social, emotional, practical and spiritual needs and develop care plans.
- Identifies patients who may require discharge planning on all Nursing Units, assesses their needs; plans and implements the discharge plans of patient.
- Collaborates with patients, families, hospital and community health care team members to provide professional service.
- Implements discharge/transfer plans by coordinating relevant individuals.
- Provides services in the areas of high-risk assessment, community referral processes, palliative care services, bereavement counseling and support, placement coordination and discharge planning.
- Counsel the patient and his family in acceptance of an adaptation to changing health conditions.
- Advocate for patients' needs and rights within the healthcare system.
- Maintain accurate and timely documentation of patient interactions and discharge plans.
